# Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> May 2020

English - I can write a letter.

Today you are going to write a response to your letter pretending to be the person you wrote to yesterday. So for example if like Carla in the reading comprehension on Mon, you wrote to your Grandad, today you must imagine you are Grandad (or whoever you wrote to) and write back the reply as though you are them.

Things to include:

- Correct letter layout (example on next two slides)
- Paragraphs
- Questions
- Interesting information to the other person
- Neat handwriting
- Spellings

This shows the different features of an informal letter.

The next slide includes paragraphs, this letter is far too short.

## Writing a Letter

There are some special rules you should follow when writing a letter.  
Here is an example of how to write a letter.


