**Curriculum question is 'Why do we know so much about Ancient Greece?'**

During Spring 2, pupils will extend their knowledge of History by researching Ancient Greece. This will be an exciting opportunity for pupils to extend their understanding of this part of history. We will learn about democracy, philosophers and the greatest achievements of Ancient Greeks. This will be achieved through inquiry and interrogating evidence.

## Mathematics

During our daily Maths lessons, pupils will continue to extend their knowledge of number when working with fractions, decimals and percentages. This will be alongside daily activities on X Tables. The activities will include problem solving, reasoning and rapid recall through a range of contexts. The approach used will follow the Maths policy CPA - Concrete, Pictoral, Abstract. This will enable the children to deepen their understanding of mathematical concepts at a mastery level. Over this term we continue to build fluency skills. This will include rapid recall of x tables and investigate the relationship between fractions/decimals and percentages.

## Science

Our big question this term is focused on Animals including Humans.

During these lessons pupils will extend their knowledge of Animals including Humans through research activities. In particular, we will be focusing on our big question 'What happens to our circulatory system during exercise?' Activities will include: identifying scientific evidence, debate, identifying the advantage/disadvantage of certain habits and choices we make. We will also be using Science throughout the curriculum within our Geography, English, History and Art activities.

## R.E

During this term, pupils will deepen their understanding of the world we live in. Our school aims will be highlighted when we enquire and debate 'How Christianity is celebrated locally and globally. During this term pupils will have opportunities to link their learning to themselves, family, school and community.
